

## BADGE REQUIREMENTS FROM CCJ2010

We did lots at CCJ'10 and while having an **EPIC AWESOME** time, the cubs potentially completed some badge/star requirements. As each cub has different levels of skill and abilities, it is up to the leader to assess how the youth participated and the requirements earned are based on the youth's own accomplishments i.e. did the youth "Do his/her best" and grant or award the appropriate badge/star requirement from the table below:

Fire Lighting	Green A7			Lay, light and safely put out a fire in the outdoors.
Woggle handed out upon arrival	Tawny A2			Make a simple article such as puppet, toy, game, papier-mache item, woggle, etc.
Rockets	Tawny A2			Make a simple article such as puppet, toy, game, papier-mache item, woggle, etc.
Blogging	Tawny A3			Type a simple message, letter, story or poem.
Semaphore	Tawny A10			Send and receive a message in code, such as Morse code, semaphore or a secret code.
Bird House making		Carpenter 3		Using basic tools, construct a project such as a bird house.
Tandy Leather Bracelet, God's Eye Craft or Medicine wheel in Aboriginal activity		Handicraft 5		Make two useful or decorative articles from wool, leather, string or other suitable material. If two out of three options were made, then requirement met.

Emergency Preparedness Activity		Emergency Preparedness 3 and 4		Recognize and give three examples of emergencies that occurred in your community or elsewhere. Describe what to do should two of the following occur: _ Lightning(when outside) _ Tornado _ Flooding _ Tsunami _ Earthquake _ Wildfires

Bird houses can also be used for other badge or star requirements, but it will require further participation from the cub. i.e. setting up and looking after it for a season.
